- Honesty Truthfulness, Fairness and Sincerity
- Fidelity Faithfulness to stakeholders, Loyalty
- Charity Kindness, caring, good will, Tolerance, Compassion and mercy
- Responsibility Reliability, dependability, accountability, trustworthiness
- Self Discipline Acting with reasonable restraint

• "The Wouff-Hong is amateur radio's most sacred symbol and stands for the enforcement of law and order in amateur operation."



- "A disciplinary object which to both flail bad operating practices and inflict punishment on the perpetrators'.
- "At each meeting of the Leagues Board, the Wouff-Hong stood on display, to the humbled looks of the Directors"

THE RADIO AMATEUR'S CODE

- The Radio Amateur is Considerate
 - Never knowingly operates in such a way as to lessen the pleasure of others.
- Loyal
 - Offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs, the ARRL through which amateur radio is represented nationally and internationally.
- Progressive
 - The station is kept up to date. It is well built and efficient. The operators practice is above reproach.

THE RADIO AMATEUR'S CODE

Friendly

• The operator sends slow and with patience when requested (CW); offers friendly advice and counsel to the beginner; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the marks of the amateur spirit.

Balanced

 Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school and community.

Patriotic

• The station and skills are always ready for service to country and community
